Welcome back after the summer break. This autumn we have a packed OCS programme. Our next lecture will be on Tuesday 11th October when Dr Luk Yu-ping, Curator of Chinese Collections in the Asian Department of the V&A will present "Chinese Jewellery in the Victoria and Albert Museum Collection". The long awaited OCS exhibition 3rd to 9th November will coincide with all the Asia Week in London activities. Our last lecture for the year will be on Tuesday 13th December which will be the Sir Michael Butler Memorial Lecture given by John Ayers and Rufus Bird on "New Discoveries of Chinese and Japanese Works of Art in the Collection of Her Majesty the Queen". This lecture will co-incide with the publication of the great work on the Royal Collections and we are extremely pleased to be able to host it.
