Rosemarie Mulcahy Scholarship for the Study of Spanish Art

Fully funded by the CEEH, the Scholarship will be tenable for a maximum of four years full-time from the academic year 2019-20. Ideally, the research project should involve study of the collections of Spanish art held in the National Gallery of Ireland.
