

Zurbarán Doctoral Scholarship for the Study of Spanish Art

The Zurbarán Centre for Spanish and Latin American Art is pleased to invite applications for a fully funded doctoral scholarship in Spanish art-historical studies, commencing at Durham University in the academic year 2021/22. The scholarship supports projects on Spanish art from the Golden Age to around 1900, including the reception of Spanish art in Britain.

The scholarship is tenable for three years full-time or five years part-time. The successful candidate will enjoy privileged access to the Spanish Gallery at The Auckland Project in Bishop Auckland, which houses one of the most remarkable collections of Spanish art in the UK. Applications should be submitted to Durham University programme following the standard process of the Durham Doctoral Studentships. Applicants are advised to contact the administration of the Zurbarán Centre (Zurbaran.Centre@durham.ac.uk) well before the deadline of 31 March.
